

Harold J. Brody, MD, received training in music and drama at Duke University. After graduation, he studied producing with the late Arthur Cantor in New York City. Regionally and in stock, he has performed principal roles in "Applause," "Sweet Charity," "An Evening with Rodgers and Hammerstein," "The Fantasticks," "How to Succeed," "Kiss Me Kate," "Bells are Ringing," "Guys and Dolls," and "Red, Hot and Cole," among others. The Brody Theater at Duke University was dedicated in 2006, and he currently serves on the National Advisory Board in the Department of Theater Studies. John E. Harris, MD, PhD, is an Assistant Professor of Medicine in the Division of Dermatology at the University of Massachusetts Medical School in Worcester, MA. He serves as Director of the Vitiligo Clinic and Research Center at UMass, focusing both on the clinical management of vitiligo patients as well as research into new therapeutic strategies. His approach includes basic, translational, and clinical studies that incorporate the use of mouse models, human tissues, and small clinical trials that determine disease mechanisms of vitiligo, identify quantifiable markers of disease activity, and test new treatments.

Translational Research in Vitiligo: Launching a New Era of Targeted Treatment

John Harris, MD, PhD

Previous work from his research team revealed that the IFN-g signaling pathway is central to both the progression and maintenance of vitiligo, and recent studies in both mice and humans have demonstrated efficacy of new immunotherapies that target this pathway. Ongoing research seeks to better characterize the mechanism of action of these new treatments and to identify new targets in order to design an optimal therapeutic strategy for vitiligo patients, who currently have no FDA-approved treatment options. Long-term goals are to bring new treatments with better safety and efficacy into the clinic, to develop more durable, long-lasting treatments, and ultimately to find a cure for this psychologically devastating disease.

Dr. Daniel Dubin is currently Vice Chairman, member of the board of managers, and Chairman of the equity capital commitment committee of Leerink Partners, a healthcare investment bank based in Boston. He joined Leerink Partners in 2001 and, over the intervening 15 years, has raised more than \$12 billion for clients in public and private equity offerings. He regularly advises life sciences companies on merger and acquisition opportunities, partnerships and public/private financing transactions. As a dermatologist, Dr. Dubin also leads the firm's dermatology and aesthetic advisory practice. He has been advisor and banker to several dermatology start-up companies and has aided in bringing innovation to dermatology through his connections to capital assets

required to create and sustain these companies through their formative stages. He serves as a director of Living Proof, a director of Olivo Labs, a science and strategy board member for Stiefel/GSK, and an advisor to SKS Ocular. He also served as Chairman of MetaWorks and was a co-founder and President of MEDACorp.

Dr. Dubin's undergraduate education was at Dartmouth College, and he is a 1992 graduate of Harvard Medical School. Following an internship in Medicine at the Massachusetts General Hospital, he completed a residency at Harvard Medical School in 1996. He is board certified in dermatology by the American Board of Dermatology (1996) and served as a staff dermatologist and ambulatory medical director of clinical dermatology at the Brigham and Women's Hospital prior to his transition to investment banking.

Dr. Martin Makary is a professor of surgery and health policy & management at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. He is the author of the *New York Times* Bestselling book *Unaccountable* about doctor-led efforts to fix healthcare through increased transparency. Dr. Makary writes for *The Wall Street Journal* and *Time Magazine* and he is a medical commentator for FOX News.

At Johns Hopkins, Dr. Makary directs several national collaboratives dedicated to improving quality and safety in health care using evidence-based medicine. He was the creator of the Surgical Checklist later popularized in the book The Checklist Manifesto. Dr. Makary served on the World Health Organization (W.H.O.) Surgery Checklist workgroup and chaired the W.H.O. technical workgroup on measuring surgical quality worldwide. Last year, Dr. Makary was named to America's 20 Most Influential People in Health Care by Health Leaders Magazine.

Dr. Makary is a graduate of Bucknell University, Thomas Jefferson University, and Harvard University and he completed his surgical residency at Georgetown University and further sub-specialty training in GI and cancer surgery at Johns Hopkins.

Donal Cameron is being raised by his grandmother, the cook at the legendary Double W ranch in Ivan Doig's beloved Two Medicine Country of the Montana Rockies, a landscape that gives full rein to an eleven-year-old's imagination.
