Advances in the Peri-operative Management of SCC

Guest Speaker: David Miller MD, PhD, FAAD Physician Investigator Cancer Center, Massachusetts General Research Institute; Assistant Professor of Dermatology and Medicine, Harvard Medical School



David M. Miller MD, PhD, FAAD, Assistant Professor in Dermatology and Medicine at Harvard Medical School and member of the Department of Dermatology and the Department of Medicine at Massachusetts General Hospital, where he is director of the Center for Merkel cell carcinoma and co-director of the non-melanoma skin cancer multi-disciplinary clinic. Dr. Miller received his medical (MD) and PhD degree in Biomedical Sciences from the University of Massachusetts. While at UMass, Dr. Miller received the American Diabetes Association Physician-Scientist

Training Award for three consecutive years, a Fuller Foundation grant, was inducted into the Alpha Omega Honor Society. He then completed a Dermatology residency at Columbia University Medical Center, followed by a residency in Internal Medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital. Following both residencies, Dr. Miller completed fellowship training in Hematology/Oncology at Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center and at the U.S. Food and Drug Administration. Dr. Miller has authored over 50 peer-reviewed publications and has delivered over 100 national and international presentations. He is the Editor-in-Chief of the Journal of Cutaneous Oncology and co-founder of the Society of Cutaneous Oncology. He is also a reviewer for several journals, including the New England Journal of Medicine, Journal of the American Academy of Dermatology, and JAMA Dermatology, among others. Dr. Miller's research is primarily focused on developing innovative treatments for advanced skin cancers. His work has garnered over one million dollars in funding from diverse sources, including the National Institutes of Health, the American Skin Association, ECOG-ACRIN, and Project Data Sphere.

A judge, attorney, educator, and musician, Marcus D. Williams served more than twenty-five years as a district and circuit court judge in Fairfax County, Virginia. He has presided over criminal cases involving murder, drug distribution, robbery, embezzlement, and larceny, as well as civil cases including medical malpractice, products liability, domestic relations, and commercial litigation.

Since retiring in 2012, Judge Williams continues to sit as a designated judge, has taught advanced English and western culture to students in Yangshuo, China, and has lectured on trial advocacy, international commercial arbitration, and public corruption, at various universities in Ukraine, Moldova, and Romania, and at the National Institute of Justice, Chisnau, Moldova. He is a mediator and arbitrator for Juridical Solutions PLC.

As a musician, Judge Williams has recorded albums and plays a mix of jazz, Latin, and rhythm and blues. He plays guitar, bass, keyboards, and saxophone. He has performed in Washington, D.C., Quebec City, London, Paris, Amsterdam, Tokyo, Bangkok, Saigon, and Yangshuo, among many other venues. Judge Williams has received awards and recognition including induction into the Virginia Lawyers Hall of Fame (2023), and Strong Men & Women in Virginia History (2020).

	Rox Anderson MD, is the Director of the Wellman Center, a prolific Thematic Research Center at MGH/HMS and the birthplace of many innovations used around the world with a robust pipeline of new capabilities. Dr. Anderson has over 80 issued patents and was recently inducted into the US Patent Office Hall of Fame. His innovations include non-scarring laser treatments in dermatology for birthmarks, vascular and pigmented lesions, scar remodeling, aging skin rejuvenation, hair removal, and more. He also contributed to treatments for vocal cords, kidney stones, glaucoma, heart disease,	

he also contributed to treatments for vocal cords, kidney stones, glaucoma, heart disease, photodynamic therapy for cancer and acne, as well as optical diagnostics including the first confocal microscope for human use. Dr. Anderson has advanced the basic knowledge of human skin photobiology, drug photosensitization mechanisms, tissue optics, and laser-tissue interactions. He recently discovered and developed cryolipolysis, a treatment using cold to induce permanent selective loss of fat, a non-opoid treatment of pain, and a new treatment for sleep apnea.

Rich Heley is an engineering executive with over 20 years of leadership experience working across Apple, Tesla, and Meta. He is an inventor and holder of more than 50 US patents including some of the earliest Apple iPhone designs where he was the Director of Manufacturing Design. At Tesla he worked directly for Elon Musk leading multiple engineering organizations and leading all products at the company. At Meta he was one of the founding employees of Building 8, a secretive research lab developing innovative hardware products and creating the Concept Engineering Organization.

Pathology Advances and Digital Imaging

Guest Speaker: Gary Tearney MD, PhD, FACC, FCAP, FNAI Endowed Professor of Pathology at Harvard and Lab Unit Director at the Wellman Center



Gary Tearney is the Remondi Family Endowed MGH Research Institute Chair, Professor of Pathology at Harvard Medical School, an Affiliate Faculty member of the Harvard-MIT Division of Health Sciences and Technology (HST) and leads his 80+ person lab at the Wellman Center for Photomedicine at Massachusetts General Hospital. His specific research interests are focused on the development and clinical validation of non-invasive, high-resolution optical imaging methods for human disease diagnosis. Dr. Tearney's lab was the first to perform human imaging

in the coronary arteries and gastrointestinal tract in vivo with Optical Coherence Tomography (OCT), which provides cross-sectional images of tissue architectural microstructure at a resolution of 10 μ m. He has also conducted many of the seminal studies validating OCT – and is considered an expert on OCT image interpretation. Among other technologies, Dr. Tearney's lab recently invented a next generation OCT technology, termed μ OCT, which has a resolution of 1 μ m and is capable of imaging cells and subcellular structures in the body. His work extends beyond his laboratory at MGH, as many of his technologies are being produced commercially.

The Future Role for Mushrooms in Medicine *Guest Speaker: Paul Stamets, Mycologist*



Paul Stamets has been a mycologist for 40 years and is the author of seven books. He is an invention ambassador for the American Association for the Advancement of Science and was inducted into The Explorer's Club in 2020. He has received numerous awards, including the National Mycologist Award from the North American Mycological Association, the Gordon and Tina Wasson Award from the Mycological Society of America, and the Disruptor Award from NextMed. In May 2024, Paul received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Synbiobeta community. Paul

believes the old growth forests contain a deep reservoir of species essential for pandemic defense. His contributions include supplying several clinical studies showing immune support with mushroom mycelium. He is a collaborator with numerous scientific organizations and research institutes. His work has entered the mainstream of popular culture: In the new Star Trek: Discovery series on CBS, the science officer is portrayed by an astromycologist, Lt. Commander Paul Stamets. His work with mycelium has become a central theme of this series. In addition, he is the primary guide to the incredible mushroom documentary Fantastic Fungi, which first appeared in theaters in fall 2019, with a 100% rating on Rotten Tomatoes. He has named four new species of psilocybin mushrooms, and a new species of mushrooms has recently been named after him: *Psilocybe stametsii*. His new book on psilocybin mushrooms, published by Random House/Penguin, is due out in Spring 2025.


Update on Advances in the Treatment of Pyoderma Gangrenosum Guest Speaker: Alex G. Ortega-Loayza MD, MCR Associate Professor of Dermatology, Oregon Health and Science University



Dr. Ortega-Loayza, a native of Lima, Peru, obtained his medical degree from Universidad Nacional Mayor de San Marcos, the oldest medical school in Latin America. He completed a research fellowship at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill before pursuing his internal medicine and dermatology training at Virginia Commonwealth University. Dr. Ortega is currently an Associate Professor of Dermatology at Oregon Health and Science University where he completed his Master of Clinical Research. He is particularly interested in the treatment

of inflammatory skin conditions and atypical wounds. His main area of research is pyoderma gangrenosum (PG). Dr. Ortega has been granted the first independent investigator grant (R01) from the NIH to study this disease which has also opened a new research portfolio for NIAMS. He leads national and international initiatives on clinical research and outcome measures to study PG; one which is the UPGRADE (Understanding Pyoderma Gangrenosum Review of Adverse Disease Effects) initiative. He has also been one of the Cochrane Scholarship awardees of the American Academy of Dermatology, selected as one of the Mid-Career faculty award recipients by the Wound Healing Society and a recipient of the Victor Newcomer research award granted by the Pacific Dermatologic Association. He is currently the president of this organization. He has been invited to give over 50 national and international presentations, has published over 150 peer-reviewed papers (more than 70 on PG alone), is a reviewer for several dermatology, immunology and wound care journals, is one of the section editors for Dermatology (Karger), and is a member of the Editorial Board for the American Journal of Clinical Dermatology.
