### How Can Evidenced-Based Care Be Given to All?

**Lionel Bañez** is Acting Associate Director of the Evidence-based Practice Center Division of the Center for Evidence and Practice Improvement of the Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality. He oversees the production of systematic reviews and other evidence reports by contractors, which are used to inform clinical practice guidelines by various medical societies. These evidence reports are also used by sister agencies within the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services to inform healthcare coverage decisions and research funding opportunities. Dr.

Bañez provides oversight for the Systematic Review Data Repository Plus (SRDR+), an open-access database designed to facilitate reuse of systematic review data. He also serves as Program Officer for several grant funded studies that focus on improving evidence synthesis methodology. Dr. Bañez earned his Doctor of Medicine degree from the University of the Philippines and underwent General Surgery training at the Philippine General Hospital. He also completed a postdoctoral fellowship at the Center for Prostate Disease Research (CPDR) of the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences (USUHS) focusing on translational cancer research, and a clinical research fellowship at Duke University focusing on prostate cancer epidemiology and biomarker discovery. Prior to joining AHRQ, Dr. Bañez was a Program Director at the Center to Reduce Cancer Health Disparities (CRCHD) of the National Cancer Institute (NCI) at the National Institutes of Health (NIH), an Assistant Professor in the Division of Urology of Duke University Medical Center, and a Staff Scientist at CPDR-USUHS.

After graduation, he stayed on as faculty where he serves as a residency director for the dermatology residency program. Dr. Morrison's clinical and research interests are chiefly focused on nail disorders, including inflammatory disease (like psoriasis or lichen planus) and malignant tumors (melanoma and squamous cell carcinoma). He is an expert in nail surgery. He also is passionate about engaging global medicine. Dr. Morrison believes that education and mentorship are critical areas with the potential to positively impact patient outcomes at home and abroad.

She specializes in treating immune-mediated dermatologic conditions, including Hidradenitis Suppurativa, Psoriasis, Atopic

Dermatitis, and Inflammatory Bowel Disease-related dermatoses with biologics and small molecules, and leads both investigator-initiated and phase 2 and 3 industry-sponsored clinical trials in these disease indications. She has received the Hidradenitis Suppurativa Foundation's Danby Research Award and the AAD's Quality Improvement Award. Dr. Porter is also the Chair of the American Academy of Dermatology's Patient Safety and Quality Committee. She is an Assistant Professor of Dermatology at Harvard Medical School.

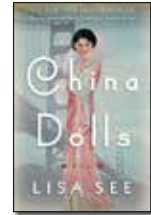

### **The MPATH Schema: A Versatile Tool for Classification, Risk Assessment, and Management of Melanocytic Lesions**

*Guest Speaker: Raymond Barnhill, MD*

*International Consultant for Melanoma, Anatomic Pathologist, Dermatopathologist, Dermatologist, and Physician-Scientist, Institut Curie, and Professor, University of Paris Cité, Paris, France*



**Dr. Raymond Barnhill** studied at Tulane University, Duke University School of Medicine, and the University of Oxford, with postgraduate training in internal medicine, dermatology, anatomic pathology, dermatopathology at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical School, the University of Miami, and Yale University. At Oxford, Dr. Barnhill was also both a Wellcome and Burroughs-Wellcome postdoctoral fellow. His principal posts: Assistant Professor of Dermatology, Yale University; Assistant and Associate Professor of Pathology, Harvard Medical School;

Co-director, Pigmented Lesion Clinic, Deputy Chief, Dermatopathology, Massachusetts General Hospital; Director of Dermatopathology, Brigham and Women's and Children's Hospitals, Boston; tenured Professor of Dermatology, Pathology, and Oncology, Director of Dermatopathology, Johns Hopkins University; Chair of Dermatology, George Washington University; Consultant, Dermatology Branch, NIH; Professor of Pathology, Co-Director of Dermatopathology, UCLA. Dr. Barnhill's research interests include angiogenesis/vascular biology, the biology and pathology of melanoma, and cancer metastasis. Dr. Barnhill and he unveiled and studied angiotropic extravascular migratory metastasis which is now accepted as an additional mechanism of cancer metastasis. Dr. Barnhill has published a large body of work on the biology, pathology, and classification of melanocytic lesions including more than 40 papers related to diagnostic accuracy and discordance with the NIH-funded MPATH Study Group. Memberships in many societies include WHO Melanoma Program (now defunct), EORTC Melanoma Group, and the Liver Metastasis Research Network. He founded the North American Melanoma Pathology Study Group and more recently the International Melanoma Pathology Study Group. He has organized international courses, symposia, and workshops on the pathology of melanocytic lesions for almost 30 years (five International Courses at Institut Curie) and gives invited lectures internationally. Major books include the Textbook of Dermatopathology (McGraw-Hill, 4 editions), Dermatopathology Challenge (McGraw-Hill), Pathology of Melanocytic Nevi and Melanoma (Springer, 3 editions), and WHO Classification of Skin Tumours. Honors include the Founders' and Nickel Awards of the American Society of Dermatopathology. Dr. Barnhill has many interests shared with his best friend, loving wife and soul mate including opera and classical music, philosophy, literature, art, and Venice.

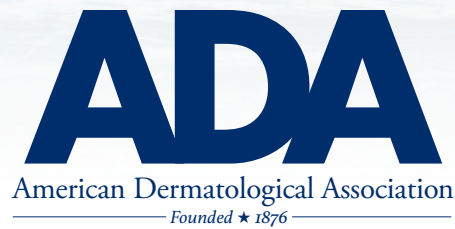
## BYLAWS ARTICLE III, SECTION 4(B.1)
