David Altshuler, MD, PhD.

David Altshuler, MD, PhD is an endocrinologist focused on the genetics of human disease and how insights into causal human disease biology can improve success discovering and developing novel therapeutics. From 2015 to 2026 he served as Executive Vice President and Chief Scientific Officer at Vertex Pharmaceuticals, leading internal research, external innovation, data technology and AI. During his time as CSO Vertex discovered, developed and launched TRIKAFTA® and ALYFTREK®, the first triple therapies for people with cystic fibrosis; CASGEVY™, the first approved medicine using CRISPR/Cas9 gene editing for the treatment of sickle cell disease and transfusion-dependent beta thalassemia; and JOURNAVX™, the first new class of pain medicine approved in more than 20 years. Before joining Vertex as CSO he served on the Board of Directors from 2012 to 2014.

Prior to joining Vertex, Dr. Altshuler was a Founding Core Member, Deputy Director and Chief Academic Officer at the Broad Institute of Harvard and MIT. He was Professor of Genetics and Medicine at Harvard Medical School and a physician at Massachusetts General Hospital (MGH). He led international projects that characterized and cataloged human genetic variation and pioneered methods and practice of genetic analysis of common human diseases. His lab identified hundreds of genetic variants associated with risk of type 2 diabetes, cardiovascular disease, autoimmune diseases and cancer across multiple populations. He continues to teach as senior lecturer in genetics and medicine at Harvard and MGH. Dr. Altshuler is a member of the National Academy of Sciences, the National Academy of Medicine, and the American Academy of Arts and Sciences. He serves on the Scientific Review Board of the Howard Hughes Medical Institute, the Board of Scientific Counsellors at the Broad Institute, the Scientific Advisory Board of the Sanger Institute, and the Board of Trustees of Rockefeller University. The Obama White House named Dr. Altshuler a Champion of Change for his leadership in creating and leading the Global Alliance for Genomics and Health. Dr. Altshuler received his bachelor's degree in life sciences from MIT and his M.D. and Ph.D. in genetics from Harvard Medical School. He completed his clinical training at MGH in internal medicine and in endocrinology, diabetes and metabolism.

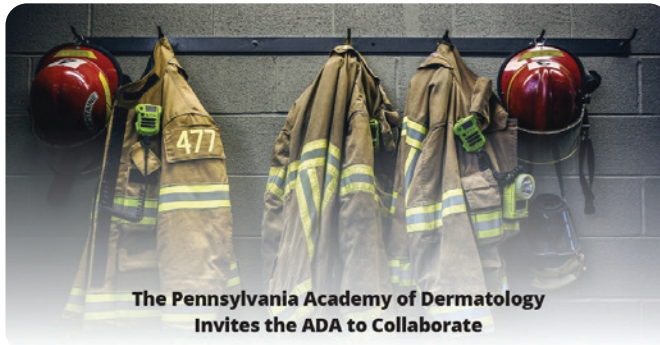

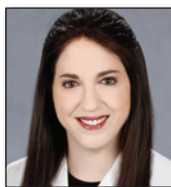

Discovering The Future: Translating Skinomics Data into Better Outcomes for Patients
Rivka Stone, MD, PhD
Associate Professor, Department of Dermatology and Cutaneous Surgery, University of Miami Miller School of Medicine



Dr. Stone is a physician scientist and dermatologist with expertise in medical, procedural, and pediatric dermatology. Her research focuses on wound healing and cutaneous fibrosis, with an emphasis on radiation-induced skin injury and biomarker development for chronic wounds. She leads a multidisciplinary translational laboratory that applies “skinomics,” integrating high throughput genomics with clinical phenotyping to identify novel pathways and therapeutic strategies for chronic wounds and fibrosing dermatoses. Dr. Stone has received funding from the Dermatology Foundation, the Wound Healing Foundation, and the NIH, and has authored numerous peer reviewed publications in leading dermatology and translational science journals. In addition to her research, she is deeply engaged in training aspiring physician scientists at the undergraduate, medical student, and resident levels and is recognized for her leadership in advancing the science of wound healing and fibrosis and positioning dermatology at the forefront of precision medicine.
